




TIMELESS STYLE

Jean-Jacques Soenen of Marcotte Style takes us to Leefdaal, a village surrounded by nature, close to Louvain, the student capital of Belgium. A little while ago, we were invited by Peter De Prins, who teaches change management, coaching and leadership techniques at Vlerick Business School. As soon as we set foot on the premises, we feel that the house has a soul. 'We were looking for an interior designer because this authentic seventeenth-century farm needed a complete home makeover', says the professor. THEATRE CURTAINS

The curtains in the living room remind us of a theatre stage. Just pull the rope and the room bathes in sunlight. Ladies and gentlemen, the show is about to begin... Closing them is just as easy. 'This system allows you to quickly open and close the curtains. It was purchased in Paris and is actually based on theatre stage curtains', Jean-Jacques tells us. The combination of colours in the concept drawing was just superb. 'You always have to wait for the real thing, of course. But once I saw the actual colour nuances, I was really satisfied with the result!'

CHARMING IN EVERY DETAIL

What used to be a stable, is now the dining room. The only thing that reminds us of the past is the stunning vaulted ceiling. Preserving it was a really good idea. It gives the room a charming look. 'At least thirty different chandeliers made it to the final selection, but in the end I chose this playful yet very stylish model', the interior decorator adds. The wainscoting gives the walls of the dining room a Long Island look and a bit of a holiday feeling. The seams of the wall covering were repeated on the surface of the interior door. A nice touch that will conceal the door when it is closed.

An incredibly beautiful made-to-measure dining table from the Marcotte Style collection was placed perpendicular to the kitchen cabinet and draws your eyes towards the idyllic garden at the back of the house.


The original oak wooden overhang received a coat of white lacquer to







WARM HEART

Between the dining table and the sitting area (before the home makeover, this was the barn) stands a round fireplace. The whole idea behind it was to sit around a crackling fire with family or friends. To create variation in the sitting area, Marcotte Style combines sofas, chairs and cushions in two different shades of grey. A high pile carpet adorns the floor. Some of the parquet floors in the house are original, other sections of the home interior received new ones. Again, there is no way you will tell the difference between the old and the new floors. The atmosphere in the dining room is an intimate one. We have the indirect lighting source to thank for that. The dining room and the sitting area seamlessly merge into one another. And yet, these are still two different spaces. We experience a feeling of openness, but the low barrier made of refined woodwork separates the two rooms.






GLOBETROTTERS
